I. How to Live Redemptively in a Conflicted World?

- Living in a conflicted world can feel uncomfortable and unpredictable.
- When we're in that environment 24/7, we can start to think and act in ways that are unlike how we usually think or act, that are maybe even unlike Jesus.
- Living in a conflicted world is something that Jesus and the early Christians had a lot of experience with. The early church didn't just survive in such a brutal world - they thrived in it.
- In the midst of conflict, God challenges us to rise to our calling in both our <u>attitudes</u> and our <u>actions</u>.

II. Rising to the Redemptive Call (Acts 4:29-32)

²⁹ Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness. ³⁰ Stretch out your hand to heal and perform signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus." ³¹ After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly. (Acts 4:29-32)

- Fear can be a powerful <u>motivator</u>. It can keep us from fully living out our mission as Christians.
- The Holy Spirit that God gives us can help us overcome this fear and live in faith, despite what's going on around us.
- "Consider their threats..." God doesn't ask us to minimize reality.
- **"Enable your servants..."** We continue to ask God to use us as we reach out to the world.

III. The Redemptive Response for Followers of Jesus (Acts 4:32-35)

³² All the believers were one in heart and mind. No one claimed that any of their possessions was their own, but they shared everything they had. ³³ With great power the apostles continued to testify to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus. And God's grace was so powerfully at work in them all ³⁴ that there were no needy persons among them. For from time to time those who owned land or houses sold them, brought the money from the sales ³⁵ and put it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to anyone who had need. (Acts 4:32-35)

- **They stayed united.** They were "one in heart and mind."
- They were generous. They "shared everything that they had."
- **They became known for their care.** They had "no needy persons among them."
- Christians were sharing the hope of Jesus in both word and action.

IV. Conclusion

- God has given us what we need in order to live faithfully instead of fearfully.
- "It's not your <u>fault</u> but it is your <u>responsibility</u>."
